The Court made the following:

ORDER

This Writ Petition is filed seeking to declare the action of respondents in not completing the investigation *in spite* of Five years, as illegal, arbitrary and violative of Articles 21 of the Constitution of India and consequently, direct the respondents complete the enquiry and submit the Final Report before the III Additional Judicial Magistrate of First Class, Ongole.

2. Grievance of the Writ Petitioner is that basing on the complaint made by the Writ Petitioner, which was referred to the respondent-police, a case in Crime No.648 of 2014 of Ongole Taluq Police Station, Prakasam, and though the FIR was registered in the year 2014, till date, the respondent-police did not complete the investigation and in that connection, the present Writ Petition was filed questioning the inaction of the respondent-police.

3. When the Writ Petition has come up before this Court for hearing, learned Assistant Government Pleader for Home representing respondent Nos.1 and 2 would submit that the Investigating Officer registered the complaint as a case in Crime No.648 of 2014 of Ongole Taluq Police Station for the offences punishable under Sections 211, 418, 409, 462, 477 read with 34 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (for brevity 'IPC'), and subsequently,

after conducting investigation, *vide* Proceedings in C.No.66/Refer/SDPO-O-2019, dated 23.01.2019, referred the case as 'False'. Accordingly, the Investigating Officer filed Final Report and therefore, no further orders are necessary in the present Writ Petition.

4. Heard. Perused the record.

5. Placing the aforesaid submission made by the learned Assistant Government Pleader for Home on record, this Writ Petition is closed. No costs

6. As a sequel thereto, the miscellaneous petitions, if any, pending in this Writ Petition shall stand closed.
