**The court made the following
ORDER:**

Since the issue raised in all these writ petitions is common, they are heard together.

The petitioners filed the present writ petitions aggrieved by the action of the Telangana State Board of Intermediate Education (hereinafter referred to as "Intermediate Board") for not permitting them to appear for the ensuing Intermediate Examination in their respective academic years i.e., 1st year and 2nd year, which have already commenced and practical examinations are already completed.

Learned counsel for the petitioners would submit that similarly situated students have filed writ petitions and writ appeals before this Court.

This Court, by an order, dated 12.02.2026 in W.P.No.4178 of 2026 and batch directed the Intermediate Board to issue Hall Tickets to the petitioners therein to enable them to appear for the ensuing theoretical Intermediate Exams scheduled to be held for the first year from 25.02.2026 and second year from 26.02.2026. The Intermediate Board is also directed to take appropriate steps to facilitate the petitioners therein, as a special case, to appear for the practical examinations, as these examinations have already completed, the Board shall schedule them at a date and time convenient as per administrative convenience.

The students, whose names have not been registered with the Intermediate Board by their respective colleges, have filed W.A.Nos.209 and 210 of 2026, wherein the Hon'ble Division Bench of this Court, while disposing of the Writ Appeals, directed the Intermediate Board to allow the appellants to register with requisite fee etc. through the concerned colleges in question by

20.02.2026 and issue hall tickets to the appellants for facing the ensuing Class 12th examinations scheduled from 26.02.2026.

Sri S.Rahul Reddy, learned Special Government Pleader appearing for the Intermediate Board would fairly concede and submit that the case of the petitioners would be considered in consonance with the order passed by this Court in W.P.No.4178 of 2026 and Batch and W.A.Nos.209 and 210 of 2026.

In the instant cases also the petitioners were not issued hall tickets enabling them to appear for the ensuing theoretical Intermediate Examinations.

For the reasons alike in the order, dated 12.02.2026 in W.P.No.4178 of 2026 and Batch and the judgment, dated 19.02.2026 passed in W.A.Nos.209 and 210 of 2026, there shall be interim direction to the Intermediate Board to verify the case of each petitioner and issue Hall Tickets to the petitioners to enable them to appear theoretical Intermediate Exams scheduled to be held for the first year from 25.02.2026 and second year from 26.02.2026.
