09/04.05.2026 Heard learned senior counsel appearing for the petitioner and learned counsel appearing for the State.

2. The petitioner is apprehending his arrest in connection with Chainpur P.S. Case No.03 of 2025, registered for the offence under Sections 190, 191(2), 191(3), 332(a), 109, 103(1), 61(2), 111(2)(b) of the B.N.S., 2023 and Section 27 of the Arms Act, pending in the Court of the learned S.D.J.M., Daltonganj, Palamau.

3. Mr. Kamal Nayan Choubey, learned senior counsel appearing for the petitioner submits that the petitioner happened to be a businessman and earlier he was doing the work of photographer and, thereafter, he has developed his business. He further submits that the petitioner is also filing income tax return. He refers Annexure-2 which is ITR acknowledgment. He then submits that the petitioner has got no criminal antecedent and that is certified by the Superintendent of Police, Ramgarh, contained in Annexure-5

series. He next submits that the petitioner has taken loan of about Rs.6 Crores from HDFC Bank, Ranchi and Ramgarh branch respectively. He also submits that in the case diary, it has come that the petitioner has got no criminal antecedent. He fairly submits that there is no doubt that so far as the brother of the petitioner, namely, Vikash Tiwary is concerned, he is having 25 criminal antecedents.

4. Learned counsel appearing for the State opposed the prayer and submits that now case diary has been received. He further submits that the co-accused has taken name of this petitioner.

5. On query made by the Court, learned counsel for the State accepts that the petitioner has got no criminal antecedent.

6. Considering that the petitioner is an income tax payee and the Superintendent of Police, Ramgarh has certified that the petitioner has got no criminal antecedent and that has also come in the case diary, which has also been admitted by the learned counsel for the State and the documents annexed with the rejoinder clearly suggests that the petitioner has taken loan of about Rs.6 Crores from HDFC Bank of Ranchi and Ramgarh branch respectively and in the attending facts and circumstances of the case, I am inclined to extend the privilege of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

7. Accordingly, the above-named petitioner is directed to surrender before the learned Court within four weeks from today and in the event of his arrest or surrender, he shall be enlarged on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.25,000/- (Twenty Five Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned S.D.J.M., Daltonganj, Palamau in

connection with Chainpur P.S. Case No.03 of 2025, subject to the conditions that the petitioner will co-operate in the investigation and also subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 482(2) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023.
